I. Checklist for a Voluntary Return



Before the Return

The returnee should

- Request set of documentation from the German authorities which would be necessary for them after the arrival as regards registration and re-registration procedures in the educational and health system as well as the job market
- Maintain kindergarten and school certificates/diplomas, training certificates/diplomas, medical reports, if any, and vaccination books for children, mainly
- Duly inform family or relatives in the home country about return dates for purposes of airport reception arrangements
- Inquire about entry procedures in case of missing valid travel passports, as lengthier ones apply for temporary travel documents (TTD)

After the Return

The returnee should

- Register entry with the border and immigration authority upon arrival
- ✓ Contact the civil registry office of the relevant municipality for the registration of new family members born abroad and identity documentation issuance, if lost
- Contact local municipal authority to apply for social welfare and registration of children to crèche
- Contact the local education office for the enrolment of children to kindergartens/ schools
- Contact the local employment office for job seeking purposes
- ✓ Contact the family doctor for registration and application of health card

II. Health Care (1/2)

I. General information

The healthcare system in Albania is mainly public. The private healthcare sector is relatively new and still under development, and it covers most of the pharmaceutical and dental services as well as some clinics for specialized diagnoses, mainly being situated in Tirana.

The Albanian law guarantees equal access to healthcare for all citizens. Public healthcare in Albania is the major provider of health services, health promotion, prevention, diagnosis and treatments for the population of Albania. Primarily, the Government of Albania funds the State healthcare system. State insurance does not cover medical costs incurred in the private sector, as a result, they are only accessible to people who can afford to pay for them.

Benefits:

- Health services to the general practitioner and family doctor

- Laboratory examinations and radiological examinations
- Tertiary unique examination with 90% refund and co-paying with 10% refund
- The drug reimbursement list 100% refund for children 0-12 months of full Invalids, pensioners, the blind and orphans
- All drugs within and outside the list 100% for veterans with chronic disease and war invalids
- Drugs with partial reimbursement for all other categories of population, in different percentages, but not less than 50% - the list of drugs versus prescription drawback, issued by the General Practitioner in all pharmacies that have contracts with the Health Insurance Fund

2. Medical treatment and medication

Medical facilities and doctors:

Procedure of admission:

The returnee contacts the public hospital's secretary office to submit their ID and health card. A visit is arranged to the relevant medical expert for examination/check-up. A medical file is opened for the patient in case they need hospitalization.

Availability and costs of medication:

Imports dominate Albania's drug market and most major international brands are present in the country. Locally manufactured products account for a small share of the total market. The prices of medicines vary on quality and manufacturer.

Health Care System: Access for Returnees

Eligibility and requirements:

The Health Insurance Fund is the only autonomous public institution, which manages and develops the compulsory healthcare insurance scheme in Albania. The Fund covers the economically active and economically inactive people are included in the health insurance scheme, with the only difference that the first pay contributions themselves, while the state budget covers the second category.

Registration procedure:

The initial registration is performed at the family's doctor. The Health Card is obtained within ten working days from the date of application.

Required documents:

Returnees should bring their ID when applying for registration of health card.

According to the World Bank, due to strong growth performance, Albania grew from the poorest nation in Europe in the early 1990s to middle-income status in 2008, with poverty declining by half during that period.

The country's economic activity is based on service provision, agriculture, and industry. Albania is a country rich in natural resources, but the economy depends on agriculture, oil processing, mineral extraction, energy, tourism, and textile industry.

The main sectors of the economy include the extractive industry, accommodation and food services, transportation, information and communication, services, processing industry, energy, gas, water and waste treatment, construction, and trade.

Albania's labour force participation rate increased to 59.6 % in December 2018, compared with 59.4 % in the previous quarter. The data reached the an all-time high of 59.6 % in December 2018 and a record low of 50.8 % in March 2014.

Albania's population is forecasted to be 2.870 Person m in December 2019 as reported by the International Monetary Fund - World Economic Outlook. It records a decrease from the last reported number of 2.874 Person m in December 2018. Albania's GDP per capita reached 5,254.193 USD in December 2018, compared with 4,551.892 USD in December 2017.

2. Ways/ assistance to find employment

The returnee applies to the Migration Counter (Sportel Migracioni) at the local employment office. The application is free of charge. The National Employment Service has facilitated the application through an online platform at http://www.puna.gov.al/

Unemployment Assistance: Access for Returnees

Eligibility and requirements: At least I year of work insurance is required for eligibility.

Registration procedure:

Eligible persons should contact the local Employment Office to collect the necessary information.

Required documents:

- Work book
- ID copy
- Family certificate
- Certificate by the tax office indicating that the person is not registered as a tax payer
- Testimony from school that the children under 18 are attending school
- Testimony from higher educational institutions for dependants up to 25 years old
- Testimony from the medical commission on the disability of dependent(s)
- Mortgage certificate of land property (if any)

3. Unemployment assistance

General information on public and/or private unemployment assistance:

- Persons who have been insured for at least 1 year of work will benefit 3 months of unemployment salaries; those insured for 3 years of work will receive 6 unemployment salaries; the ones insured for 5 years of work insurance will benefit 9 unemployment salaries; 10 years of insurance at work receive 12 months of unemployment assistance.
- Women above 55 and men above 60 will receive 12 months of unemployment salary under the condition of having contributed 1 year to the social insurances.

Benefits and Costs:

The basic level of unemployment benefits for each beneficiary is 50% of the country's minimum wage, around 220 USD per month.

Persons who meet the conditions for obtaining unemployment benefits are entitled to receive additional family income above the basic amount, to the extent of 5% of the unemployment benefit, for each dependent child up to the age of 18 years of age, as well as for persons who are continuing studies or are disabled, up to the age of 25 years.

When a court decision divorces the parents, the family supplement is given to the parent in charge of the child(ren).

4. Further education and training

Regional Directorates of Public Vocational Training under the National Employment Service offer different vocational training courses in Tirana, Durres, Vlore, Korce, Shkoder, Gjirokaster and Elbasan. They offer free of charge services for returned migrants.

Average rent, running costs/utilities

Monthly rent varies depending on the size of the dwelling and location, with downtown being more expensive. Tirana is the most expensive city with prices ranging from around 390 EUR for 2-room-flats to 520 EUR for 3-room-flats and 670 EUR for 4-room-flats. Monthly utilities for two people (electricity, water bills, gas, heating) is 65 USD on average.

Demand and supply

Tirana, as the capital of the country, offers more housing opportunities and higher rent prices.

Housing facilities for returnees / social housing

Albania has a Social Housing Strategy aimed at providing low and middle-income households who cannot afford a house in the open market with available, accessible, affordable and quality housing solutions. In particular, the scheme aims at households with vulnerability indicators resulting in housing exclusion.

However, the Ombudsman's office has observed that most municipalities have no budget allocated for social housing purposes.

Returned migrants can benefit from a social housing program, with rental fees paid partly or fully by the local government authority.

3. Social grants for housing

In case the social housing rental fee exceeds 25% of the household's net income, the local authority subsidies the rental grant. The priority beneficiaries are orphans, disabled people, returned migrants, Roma community, etc.

The set of documentation is filed to the local municipal office and is subject to additional requirements.

IV. Housing (2/2)

Housing: Access for Returnees/Vulnerable Groups

Albania has a Strategy for Social Housing (2016 – 2025). The local Government authorities are responsible for the assessment of the housing needs. The social administrators, part of the social assistance units, verify the financial status of the individuals/ families who have applied for social housing. The Strategy of Social Housing proposes two different directions with regard to social housing. On the one hand, the social housing programs help those families who can hardly afford market prices due to their unfavourable financial situation. Such is the program offering low cost houses and soft loans to these families and which can be applied through the National Housing Agency. On the other hand, social programs aimed at helping out categories that remain marginalized in the housing market due to unfavourable status indexes such as Roma and Gypsy communities, orphans, disabled and elderly people.

There is a shelter in Tirana for victims of trafficking run by the NGO "Different and Equal" (D&E) which can also accommodate victims of domestic violence.

There is an NGO running a shelter for women who suffered domestic violence, Counselling Center for abused Women and Girls (CCWG). It offers Counselling, psychosocial support and referral.

There is also a Government run shelter, under State Social Services auspices (Address: Rruga e Durresit, Tel: +355 44541821, Email: info@sherbimisocial.gov.al), which requires that women should have a protection order to be accepted to it. The juridical court issues the protection order based on a request by the victim, their legal representative and the police officer or prosecutor. Whereas the shelters run by the NGOs have an initial screening (interview) to confirm that the applicant is a victim of domestic violence, no further entry conditions apply.

According to the "National Strategy for Social Protection 2015 - 2020", the economic assistance scheme is the main instrument for "alleviating poverty" in the country. However, the payment currently has a limited impact on poverty reduction. There are currently about 80 000 families who benefit from scheme payments. The Economic Assistance Scheme targets relatively well the low-income families, as the poorest part of the population (20% of the population in the country, but not all within this group may be considered poor) benefits 56% of the scheme's spending.

Costs:

The relevant local government covers the costs.

Benefits:

The calculation for full grants is made in line with the household structure, but it cannot exceed 78 USD/month.

2. Pension System

The first pillar in the Albanian pension scheme is the PAYG funded system, publicly managed and "defined benefits" (DB) where benefits are calculated according to a specific formula based on the number of working-years, wages earned, as well as the contributions paid.

The second pillar is that of privately managed, voluntary contributed and defined contributions (DC). Law no. 10197, dated 10.12.2009 "Voluntary pension funds" consolidated the legal basis in the private pension market.

Benefits:

The retired receive retirement payments on a monthly basis.

3. Vulnerable Groups

Families without income, orphans who are not provided institutional assistance, victims of trafficking, victims of domestic violence, and minors under guardianship are considered vulnerable groups and targeted by the social welfare system. The assistance is provided mainly by government institutions such as the State Social Service (SSS).

The social administrators at the social services departments in the municipal units collect the set of documents such as a copy of the ID of the applicant and potentially other family members. The administrator, then completes an online application for economic aid, which summarizes the information on: family composition, education and employment; type of dwelling; household assets / assets; income from social protection programs.

The Office for Vulnerable Children and Youth in Albania (FLA) also provides assistance to children and youth whose rights are violated due to the behavior of the state administration and if their families do not have the opportunity to cover the costs of legal aid.

Social Welfare System: Access for Returnees

Eligibility and requirements:

Any returned migrant has access to the social welfare scheme like any other citizen of the Republic of Albania.

Registration procedure:

The returned migrant needs to register at the respective local municipal unit.

Registration documents:

IDs; Declaration on the economic status of the family; Family certificate; House ownership documents; Unemployment certificate; School registration document for children.

Primary education: 82.8% of the active school age group attends studies. During 2017-2018 650.153 students attended studies, 3.8% lower than the previous academic year. Education is compulsory for the first 9 grades. The academic year is divided into two semesters beginning in September/ October and ending in June/ July.

Secondary education: known as *regular* takes a further three years to complete. The focus is on academic teaching and preparation for university. Many schools have recently been rebuilt and are being equipped with modern technologies.

Tertiary education: is represented through a significant number of both public and private. Universities in Albania that are well dispersed in the major cities. The University of Tirana is the oldest and biggest with a current student population approaching 15,000 and a teaching staff of nearly 900. Its faculties include economic sciences, foreign languages, history and philology, medicine, natural sciences, law, social sciences, and physical education.

Vocational education is an alternative to regular school takes between 2 to 4 years depending on whether a simple diploma or a full trade qualification is desired.

2. Cost, loans and stipends

Public education is free up to secondary level. Public University tuition fees vary from USD 235 to USD 372 per year. Tuition fees in private universities are higher and vary from USD 2,400 to USD 3,600.

Only a limited number of students with excellent scores are granted scholarships from the university. There are other categories such as students coming from no-income families, orphans, students who have lost parental guardianship, students identified as victims of trafficking, disabled students, etc. who are exempt from tuition fees. Their attendance is funded through local government authorities or social services.

The student should deposit the relevant documents to the University Secretariats: the personal request for a scholarship, the ID, the family certificate, a testimony from local municipality that the student's family is benefiting from social welfare grants, the testimony of the orphan status, the medical report of disability, court decision if the student has lost parental guardianship, etc.

3. Approval and verification of foreign diplomas

The application can be done either online or in written request deposited to the Educational Service Centre (QSHA). In addition, the applicant should submit the diploma obtained in a third country, score lists, a copy of ID and certification of payment.

Educational System: Access and Registration Procedure for Returnees

Returnees should approach the local Educational Directorate to register their children. Free of charge training is provided for returned migrants at Regional Directorates of Public Vocational Training in 7 districts of the country.

VII. Concrete Support for Returnees

I. Reintegration assistance programs

As of 2010, the Government of Albania has made continuous efforts to develop and implement a policy framework on returning migration and reintegration. The core element of the reintegration mechanism is to be found in the Migration Counters located at 36 regional and local employment offices throughout the country, which assess the reintegration needs of returning migrants and refer them to existing public services, such as health, education employment and so forth.

The establishment of such mechanism illustrates the efforts of the country to consolidate institutions that deliver services and social support and to increase the overall access of the population to public services.

2. Financial and administrative support

The only financial support is the social welfare grant allocated by the local government authority.

Returnees can look for administrative support in the offices of local municipalities and of local employment services.
